

## **FLUTE and ORGAN CONCERT**

Mar. 21 at Exeter Congregational

The Congregational Church in Exeter at 21 Front Street, just up from the bandstand, is offering a concert of delightful music for Flute and Organ on Sat., March 21, 2009 at 7:30 PM. Flutist Trisha Craig will join organist Beverly Caldon for repertoire ranging from Baroque sonatas to contemporary works, showcased well by the glorious pipes of the sanctuary organ. The program will include music by Telemann, Foote, McMichael, and J.S.Bach. The reception immediately following will celebrate Bach's 324<sup>th</sup> birthday! The organ is a 3-manual Aeolian-Skinner with 20 ranks of pipes. Suggested donation is \$8 for adults, \$5 for seniors + students, and children under 8 free.

Flutist Trisha Craig is the Owner and Director of Music Makers in Hampton, NH. She received the Bachelor of Music from Ithaca College and the Master of Music in Flute Performance from Longy School of Music. She is currently the Adjunct Flute Instructor at Johnson (VT) State College and teaches flute at The Governor's Academy and Ted Herbert's Music School. She has performed as a soloist and in chamber ensembles throughout the region and was featured in an international music festival in Ireland.

Beverly Caldon is the organist/choir director at the church. She earned Bachelor's and Master's degrees in Music Education (organ) from UNH in Durham. Previously she worked as music director at the UCC Church in Keene, and at St. George's Episcopal Church in Durham. She taught organ as a faculty member at Keene State College for eighteen years and accompanied many faculty recitals. Beverly accompanied concert tours to Europe with the Monadnock Chorus, as well as a tour to Russia with the NH Friendship Chorus. She has performed numerous organ recitals as a member of the American Guild of Organists.
